Ed and Cecilia Dalbello are dedicated missionaries sharing the love of Christ with families, children, and young people. As ordained ministers with the Assemblies of God, they have devoted their lives to ministry, serving in the United States and throughout Latin America.

Originally from Brazil, the couple began their ministry in Savannah, Georgia, spending five years as children's pastors. While there, Ed managed a successful electronics business. However, in 2003, they felt called to full-time missions and made the decision to leave their careers behind. This led them to Argentina, where they served as National Coordinators for Latin America Child Care (LACC) and ministered to churches and schools by providing counseling, seminars, and leadership training.

In 2014, the Dalbellos redirected their efforts to Brazil, where they established the Royal Rangers ministry—a program aimed at Christ-centered discipleship for children and youth. They have worked diligently to translate and adapt the curriculum into Portuguese, ensuring access to impactful biblical training for young people across Brazil. Their leadership has reached thousands, equipping them with essential skills and a robust spiritual foundation.

In addition to their work with Royal Rangers, Ed and Cecilia are deeply committed to family ministry. They conduct marriage seminars, offer counseling, and lead programs to support underprivileged children. Ed holds a Doctorate in Christian Clinical Counseling and has written several books on marriage, youth restoration, and children's ministry. Meanwhile, Cecilia, with her background in teaching and counseling, is passionate about compassion ministry and actively mentors young women while supporting underserved communities.
