## Tom and Brooke Harshberger

Tom and Brooke Harshberger have been serving as missionaries to **Northern Ireland since 2018**, with a heart for reaching communities through creativity, compassion, and the local church. Their ministry focuses on **children's outreach, community development, and church revitalization**.

In 2023, the Harshbergers stepped into a new role as **associate pastors at Omagh Community Church**, located in the western region of Northern Ireland, just 30 minutes from the Republic of Ireland border. Omagh is a community still marked by the tragic 1998 bombing that claimed 29 lives and left a lasting impact on its people. The church, initially founded by a group of Church of Ireland congregants seeking a deeper experience with the Holy Spirit, has undergone a revitalization under the leadership of Pastor Tim Shiels. Tom and Brooke are honored to be part of this new season of growth and healing, helping to strategize and develop ministry in a historically underserved area with a small evangelical presence.

A key component of their ministry is **Party Create!**, a vibrant kids outreach program that uses creativity and fun to share the gospel with children. Omagh Community Church has generously provided space for **Party Create HQ**, allowing the Harshbergers to turn the town into a hub for **children's ministry and outreach** throughout the region.

Though they **commute over 1.5 hours each way** from Dundrum several times a week, they are actively seeking housing in Omagh to be in the community full-time.

Looking ahead, Tom and Brooke are preparing for their **first full itineration in the U.S.** beginning in November 2025. They look forward to visiting churches, small groups, and youth ministries to share powerful testimonies of what God is doing in Northern Ireland and to build continued partnerships for prayer and support.

Grateful for the faithful support of churches and individuals, Tom and Brooke remain committed to **bringing light**, **hope**, **and the love of Jesus to Northern Ireland—one family**, **one child**, **one community at a time**.
